Partnership requirements

- Each partner is
 - a legal entity
 - registered, either in Finland or Russia
 - directly responsible for the preparation and implementation of the project
- Each project has at least one partner from both Finnish and Russian core area



Partnership expectations

- Operational and financial stability
- Experience in international cooperation especially between Finland and Russia
 - expected at least from the lead partner
- Public-private-people partnerships are encouraged



Lead partner principle

LEAD PARTNER

- Leads project preparation, submits the application
- Grant contract with MA
- Operational responsibilities
 - Launching project implementation
 - Project coordination
 - Communication among partnership
 - Delivery of outputs
- Financial responsibilities
 - Grant transfers to partners
 - Audit procedures

- A unique perspective to the chosen programme priority
- Knowledge-based or innovative approach
- Sustainability of actions and results



The devil lies in the details

- Concrete outputs and results
 - > Well defined indicators
- Efficient workplan and realistic schedule
- Reasonable and realistic budget

Pro-tip: start your project preparation with the logical framework approach



Ease the workload of expert evaluation

- Readable application
 - Find a balance between the big picture and relevant details
 - Use the same logic througout the project plan
- Understandable text
 - Avoid jargon
 - Explain abbreviations and acronyms
